He that goeth forth and weepeth, bearing precious seed, shall doubtless come again with rejoicing, bringing his sheaves with him.

### **Psalm 121**

I will lift up mine eyes unto the hills, from whence cometh my help.

My help cometh even from the Lord, who hath made heaven and earth.

He will not suffer thy foot to be moved, and he that keepeth thee will not sleep.

Behold he that keepeth Israel shall neither slumber nor sleep.

The Lord Himself is thy keeper, the Lord is thy defence upon thy right hand.

as it was in the beginning is now and ever shall be, world without end, Amen


## About the Artists

**Katrina L. Keat** hails from Greenville, South Carolina, and is an active performer as both a soprano and conductor. She received her BA in voice from Benedictine College where she focused heavily on music from the Baroque. She co-founded her own ensemble, Benedictine Baroque, and performed such works as Leonardo Leo's *Salve Regina* and J. S. Bach's *Jauchzet Gott*. After the completion of her bachelor's degree, Keat began the pursuit of a conducting career, taking a position of Director of Sacred Music at St. John the Baptist Catholic Church in



Corpus Christi, Texas. Her primary focus was to bring large liturgical works of music back to their rightful place in the liturgy. While there, she conducted works such as Byrd's *Mass for Five Voices*, Haydn's *Missa brevis Sancti Joannis de Deo*, and Durufle's *Requiem*. Keat then pursued a master's degree in conducting at the University of Notre Dame where she studied conducting with Carmen Helena Tellez, and continued her vocal study with Deborah Mayer. While at Notre Dame, she conducted works such as Monteverdi's *Il combattimento di Tancredi e Clorinda* and Campra's *Requiem*. She also conducted while simultaneously singing Mozart's *Exsultate Jubilate*. She also performed a recital of music for soprano and organ in the Basilica of the Sacred Heart along with Carina Sturdy. After having completed her studies, Keat became the Director of Music at St. Agnes Catholic Church in Arlington, Virginia, where she continues to perform.

**Carina Sturdy**, Associate Director of Music at Saint Bede, earned her Bachelor of Music degree in Organ Performance at the University of North Carolina School of the Arts studying with Dr. Timothy Olsen. She spent a year studying organ at the University of Notre Dame with Dr. Craig Cramer and working at the Basilica of the Sacred Heart. In addition to playing numerous solo concerts including recitals at the Spoleto Festival, the Cathedral Basilica of St. Augustine, and Bruton Parish Church, Carina has placed in both regional and national music competitions. She has competed in the Quimby/AGO Competition for Young Artists, placing second in the Mid-Atlantic regional competition in 2017. She served as organ scholar for the Royal School of Church Music Carolina Course at Duke University in the summer of 2017. Carina has also served as the Organist for Main Street United Methodist Church in Kernersville, NC and Organ Scholar for Bruton Parish Church in Williamsburg, VA. Growing up in Williamsburg, Virginia, Carina played fife and harpsichord for Colonial Williamsburg. She became an avid hand bell ringer at the age of 12 and went on to start two hand bell ensembles. She serves as a member at large for the Tidewater Chapter of the American Guild of Organists.
